Hello.

My name is Jesse Hajer, and I am an Assistant Professor in the Department of Economics and Labour Studies Program at the University of Manitoba. I am currently leading a research study with Ian Hudson (Professor of Economics), and Jennifer Keith, (PhD student, Department of Indigenous Studies) on the impact of the austerity agenda implemented by the Government of Manitoba. We are partnering with several public sector unions and over two dozen Manitoba academics on this project.

We seek to document opinions, experiences, and perspectives on the impact of provincial government austerity on public services and programs and work conditions for public sector workers, including those delivering public services through non-profit and organizations with government funding. By austerity, we mean expenditure and staffing cuts and restraints, as well as privatization and contracting out.

We are conducting a survey of public service workers (including those working in the non-profit sector delivering public services with provincial government funding) to gather information for this project. The survey is an opportunity for your experiences, expertise and opinions to be part of the study. The survey will take about 20 minutes and will be confidential.

Our research aims to be useful and of interest to public sector workers, and a resource to educate and share knowledge with decision makers and Manitobans more broadly. We plan to publish our work as a book and a series of one-page “Fast Facts” through the Canadian Centre for Policy Alternatives Manitoba website and other media.
